Tuttle students learn about saving money in a bank

Tuttle fourth graders were challenged in an outreach program sponsored by First National Bank & Trust Co. on May 9 when asked what items they feel are worth saving their money.

FNBT Manager Katie Sanders and Teller Ashley Witcher demonstrated the importance of saving money by reading multiple activity stories, asking questions and playing a game.

“It is important that we pay it forward with the knowledge that we have today,” Sanders said. “It is my hope that the children learn the importance of saving. We live in a society of instant gratification; we want what we want now. Teaching the kids to look at the bigger picture of saving is most important.”

During the “Mr. Right” listen game, the students had to listen for the clue words to the story to determine if the few scattered prize items needed to be passed to the person to the left of them or the right.

The concept of the game was for the students to listen and learn about why saving money in a bank is better than spending money on wants like small toys.

“There are many perks to saving money in a safe place like a bank,” Sanders said. “If you save your money in a bank, you could earn interest and if a flood, fire or tornado were to hit your house it would stay safe.”
